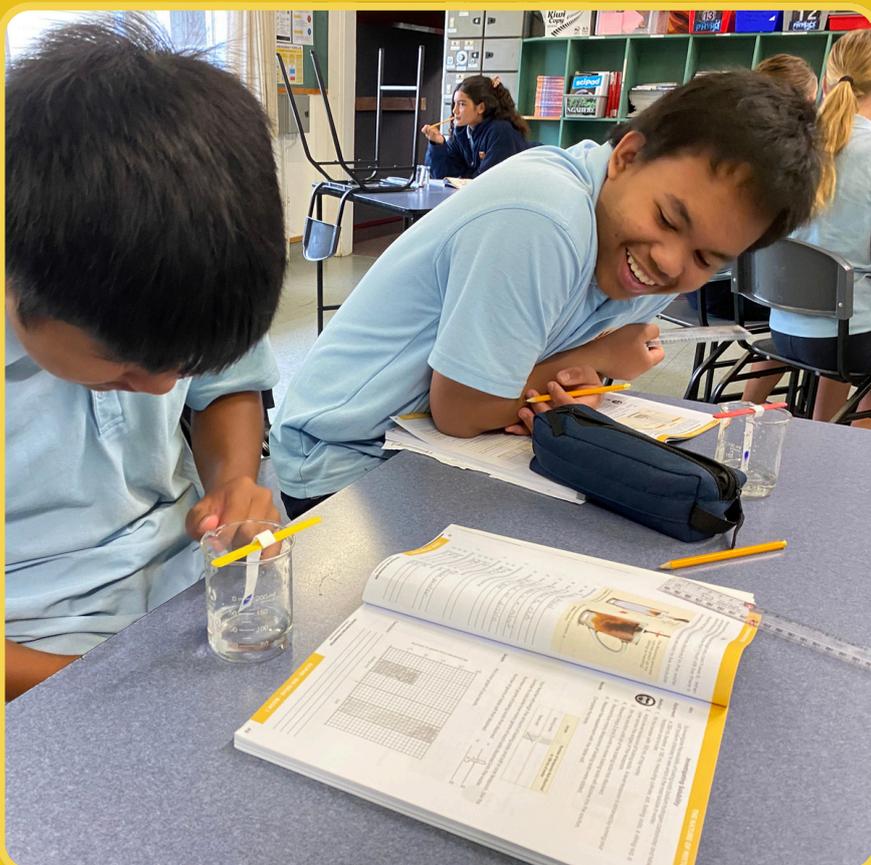
## Junior Young Farmers Agri-Skills and Education Day

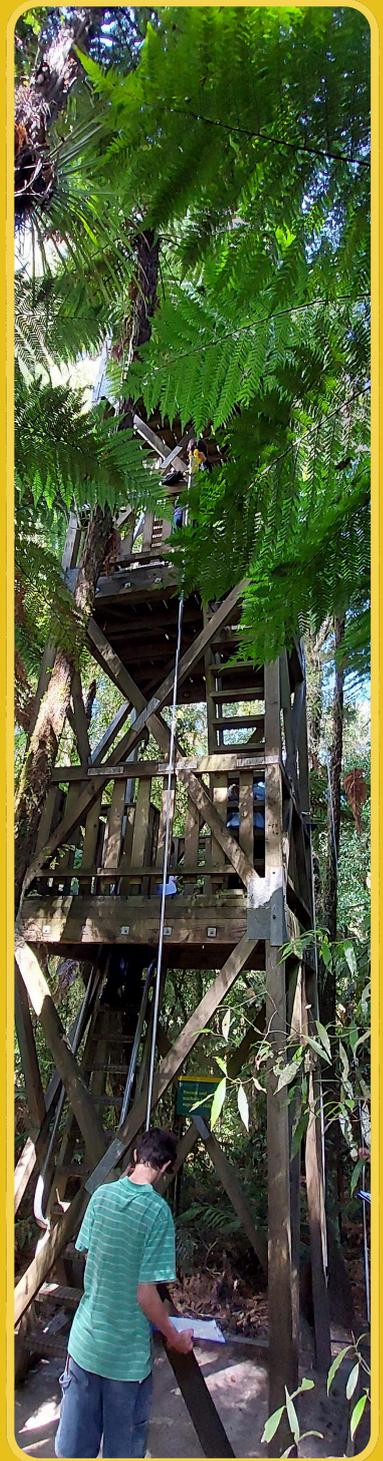
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# PUREORA FOREST

On Monday 10th March, Ms. Rymer, Whāea Victoria and the Year 12 Biology students embarked on an excursion to Pureora Forest, situated approximately 15 minutes southeast of Benneydale.

The objective of the biologists was to measure humidity, temperature, wind speed and light intensity at various heights utilising the Department of Conservation (DOC) tower. This data collection aimed to identify differences in environmental conditions and to understand how plants within distinct layers of the forest have adapted to thrive in their respective habitats. The experience provided students with a valuable glimpse into the practical aspects of being an ecologist in the field.

Overall, it was a highly successful trip, enriched by the enthusiasm of an exceptional group of students!
